- Achieved official 501c(6) designation




Harmonization

In May 2021, IIBA implemented a Harmonization initiative to bring all of the global chapters into alignment with the parent organization.

- Going forward, chapters will be held to the established standards more stringently in the past. To maintain
 our charter, we must demonstrate regular activities, maintain a minimum number of board members, and
 file business, financial and strategic plans with IIBA.
- Kansas City metropolitan area IIBA members were automatically assigned to the Kansas City chapter.
- Members may choose another chapter to be their "home" chapter if they wish.
- Members of IIBA in good standing are eligible to participate in any of their own or another chapter's activities at the posted member price.
- Non-members may be assessed single event fees or other participatory charges.

Chapter Census November 2020 - December 2021




As a result of Harmonization, we gained 29 members, a 49% increase in overall membership. Every month, the chapter receives \$15 per member from IIBA, in lieu of separately assessed chapter membership dues.

With an average of 90 members, this amounts to \$1,350 projected annual revenue.

- Set up Google Analytics profile to track site usage and gather data to add value for members.


2021 Survey Results



(Required) As a business analysis professional, how do you see your career interests evolving in the next 1-3 years? Please select all that apply.



We have variety of activities we could offer in addition to our regular meetings. Which of the following would you be most likely to participate in ...ssociated price point? Please select all that apply. 29 responses







What is something we should START doing as a chapter? (Responses)

- Have a PDD.
- BA development day annually or biannually
- DEI focus
- Explore if offering virtual lunch & learns might be of interest to members maybe let the attendees drive the topic based on what challenges they are currently facing in their work.
- Having meetings twice a month (virtual & in person/no expectations for condiments)
- Would love to see mentoring, open townhall type sessions
- I like the idea of hands on workshops Saturday sessions
- Providing volunteer opportunities with nonprofits
- Be intentional about building community within the chapter in ways beyond open-ended networking. Look for ways to help those less comfortable with networking to connect with potential colleagues. Find additional ways to connect with BAs in the KC area, especially those who do BA work but don't have the formal job title.
- Agenda for the entire year
- Talk more about the everyday BA analysis, topics tools or skills discussion around BA skill sets that they face daily. Example: Scrum
 master, Visioning sessions, Business analysis in an Agile environment, User stories, How does a BA support a Product Owner in an
 Agile world, etc The subjects are more high level for experience BA and the topics do not leave room for BA to focus on the skills that
 we deal with daily in an Agile environments.

What is something we should KEEP doing as a chapter? (Responses)
